On July 7, the Gallatin River had dropped enough that the channel where our headgate is located (former main channel) was starved of water leaving us with no irrigation water. The timing of this drop in water created the emergency as our lessee (Jason Camp co-applicant) had his first of hay cut and there was an immediate need to irrigate to preserve the health of the crop and

prevent loss of the 2nd cutting.

Emergency Action Taken: A small side channel was activated off of the main channel

upstream that conveys water back to the old channel passing by our headgate. Gravel was excavated from the bed of the small channel for approximately 100 yards from the head of the small channel downstream toward the main channel pulling grade to draw water into the side channel. The excavated gravel was spoiled on the banks of the side channel, avoiding vegetation whenever possible. Additionally, spoiled gravel was added to an existing bar and downed tree immediately adjacent to the head of the small channel in the main channel of the Gallatin River. By July 17, the river had dropped enough to starve the side channel again

(starving our headgate as well) and on July 19, the bed of the small channel was excavated further with gravel spoils placed on the banks of the side channel and placed into the main channel in the

same manner as before.

Emergency Action Date: 7/10/2018 & 7/19/2018

Inspection Comments: Emergency channel is working well for now. Leave as is for now, no

remediation.

M Rotar: Work went on this year. The main channel is to the east and water availability ceased at the new headgate. It happened a couple of times, but for not it seems to be working okay. Care was taken to not destroy vegetation.
